Many others are working on the mandatory PhD Internship Agreement which outlines the parties, roles and responsibilities and project details of their internship. Professional internships are being developed in organisations including: i2Eye Diagnostics Ltd., BioAscent Discoveries Ltd.; Association for International Cancer Research; Wildlife Information Centre; The Royal Society London; Cults Academy.
